WHAT DOES  
"SILOSO" MEAN?

The name **SILOSO** came from a medicinal plant called **SELUSUH** which was used traditionally by Malay women during childbirth. It is believed that they could be found and used by the local settlers here.

Explore the historical timeline and legends of the Singapore Straits, the seas between Sentosa and the mainland, through a series of paintings on the walls, road and rocks at the **"WAVES OF THE STRAITS"**.

**FORT SILOSO WAS ONCE CALLED SARANG RIMAU (TIGER'S DEN).**

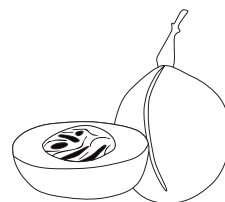

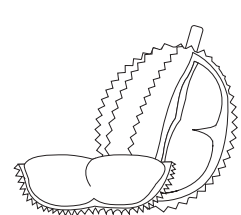

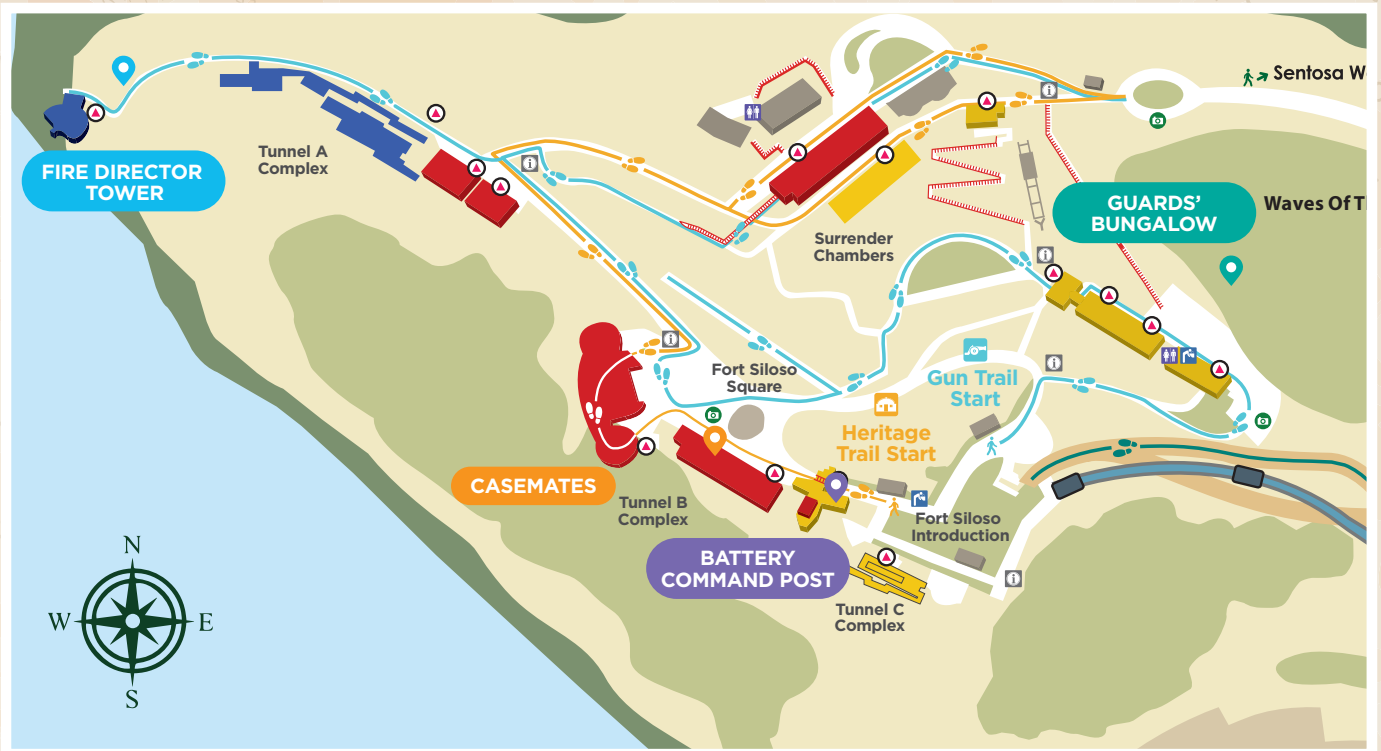
# HERITAGE TRAIL
