74th National Monument.





## About The Fort



Fort Siloso was built in the late 19th century. During that time, Singapore had become an important trading port for the British, so it was imperative that the island was protected from sea invasion.

However, during World War II, Japanese troops invaded Singapore by land from north Malaya. This led the British to

turn Fort Siloso's guns towards the mainland instead to help support the ground forces defending Singapore from the invasion.

Today, more than 70 years after the war, Fort Siloso stands as a beloved historical site. The only preserved coastal fort in Singapore, it is home to a wealth of WWII memorabilia, including coastal guns and the remains of fortified military structures and tunnels.

Begin your exploration from the Fort Siloso Skywalk, a treetop trail set 11 storeys above ground. You may also choose to explore the fort by the Heritage Trail or the Gun Trail, both of which are sure to take you on an unforgettable journey back in time.

# Surrender Chambers



Relive some of the momentous events in Singapore's history with the Surrender Chambers immersive show. Be guided by light, sound and video effects starting from the Japanese invasion, all the way to the Japanese's eventual surrender at the end of WWII.

Let yourself be transported back in time through the stories of people who lived during the Japanese Occupation, and experience the Allied forces' counter-attack and the end of the war through six interactive zones. Before you leave, share a message of peace on the wall of poppies.

### Surrender Chambers

Step into the Surrender Chambers and let the lights, sounds and videos guide you through the story of Singapore during WWII, from 1942 to 1945.



### Yellow Zone

Find out what a soldier's life was like at the fort. From the cramped quarters of a troopship, to the amenities at the fort and the underground complex at Tunnel C, explore these places for the ultimate experience!



### Blue Zone

Make your way through the tunnel to the Fire Director Tower at the tip of Siloso Point, where soldiers were once stationed to spot incoming naval ships.



### Red Zone

Uncover extraordinary moments in the war that changed the world. Walk through a range of epic exhibitions such as the Fall of Singapore, the sombre Prisoners of War art, and many more.

Once you enter Fort Siloso from the Skywalk, you can choose between two walking trails: the Heritage Trail and the Gun Trail, which military history buffs will definitely enjoy.

## Getting to Fort Siloso



### Sentosa Beach Shuttle

Board Sentosa Beach Shuttle and alight at Siloso Point.



### Sentosa Bus

Board Bus A or C and alight at Siloso Point.



### Singapore Cable Car (Sentosa Line)

Board Cable Car, Sentosa Line and alight at Siloso Point.



### Taxi/Car

Drive into Sentosa via Sentosa Gateway.

#### For Taxi:

Drop off at Siloso Point.

#### For Car:

Park at Beach Station Carpark and transit to either the Sentosa Beach Shuttle or Sentosa Bus A or C and alight at Siloso Point.
